



Guidelines for Out of Uniform Days

Rationale – Kotara High School SRC has an excellent reputation for assisting with fundraising for charities. One of the ways we raise funds is to allow students, on some occasions, to ‘**come out of uniform**’.

Our expectations

It is expected that students will follow acceptable dress codes that are in keeping with the expectations of our community. The issue of safety is paramount in schools and clothing must satisfy the requirements of a school setting and allow the curriculum to be met. Certain subject areas such as: Science, Hospitality, Design and Technology, Technics Wood and Metal and Visual Art have specific practical requirements that must be followed.

Suitable Clothing includes

T Shirts, Shirt, Jumper (warm tops in winter)

Jeans, Shorts, Skirts

Sneakers, shoes – footwear must be enclosed and protective

Students will be required to change into suitable sports clothes for all PD/H/PE lessons on out of uniform day.

Unsuitable clothing includes

Tops with unacceptable slogans, strapless tops bare midriffs or plunging necklines on boys or girls.

Pants that are precariously balanced below the hips

Sandals, platform/high heel shoes, thongs

Anyone wearing out of uniform clothes that are unacceptable will be sent to the Deputy Principal. The students name will be recorded as being out of uniform. Parents will be contacted and asked to bring suitable clothing to the school. Should the situation warrant it parents will be called to collect the child and the child will be sent home to change.

There is NO compulsion for any student to be ‘*out of uniform*’ but any student who chooses to support the fundraiser should dress according to these guidelines.
